4439. NOTIFICATION OF INTERESTS

Councillors were asked to declare interests in the matters to be discussed and reminded that changes to their Register of Interests must be made within 28 days.

4440. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Resolved: The minutes of the meeting held on 9th November, 2016 having been circulated, were agreed and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

4441. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The meeting was suspended to allow residents to speak.

Including Police Report

October Crimes – A male was assaulted after a verbal altercation at a hotel in Pilling and a male reported that he had caused damage and had a knife in a public place in Pilling.

Anti-Social Behaviour – An incident of fly tipping was reported on Garstang Road and a fight reported outside a hotel in Pilling. A Pilling person reported a social worker for breaching data protection when confidential documents were returned and there was a report of a dog being attacked by another dog on Woods Lane, Eagland Hill.

November Crimes – A resident of School Lane reported his key had been used to take his car, but these were subsequently returned, both a male and female in Scronkey reported being assaulted by the other in a domestic violence incident and an offender involved in a traffic accident on Head Dyke Lane was found to be in possession of a quantity of drugs. An unknown offender removed a garage door at a Caravan Park, on Head Dyke Lane and took a vehicle.

Anti-Social Behaviour – A group of youths were reported causing nuisance outside the Ellison Arms and that lights were on inside the premises, two traveller caravans were reported to have



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set up camp on Lane Ends Amenity Site, but moved on later and a female in Pilling reported being the victim of cyber bullying. A cyclist male required hospital treatment after riding his bike into a pothole on Garstang Road.

Wyre Councillor Holden

Cllr. Holden was requested to pursue advice and opinion on the mounting of a traffic mirror at Broadfleet Bridge to assist drivers following the recent accident which knocked the balustrade into the road.

The meeting was resumed.

Representative on Pilling Memorial Hall/Pilling 20:20

Cllr. P. McWhirter reported on an additional yellow barrier to the site to prevent vehicles using the car park at night. Trees are to be planted over the weekend. The Big Lottery bid was returned recently for its final check through prior to submission.

Water Meeting on 25th November

Cllr. G. Curwen reported on the frustration expressed at the meeting with lack of progress with promised actions. The pinch points in the dyke systems still hasn't been touched, the new outfall is still too small to ensure movement of the silt on the seaward side and desilting the channel was not carried out during the recent improvements. There was a suggestion from Natural England that the channel is desilted annually, although the license applied for by Hy-Fly for desilting has not been processed. Weekly updates are now sent via the NFU concerning the Environment Agency work in the area.
