Chairman's Report

One of the first roles of the parish council is to represent the parishioners. This is particularly important given the government policy of moving responsibilities downwards from central government to borough councils and then to the parish council. Bearing this in mind, it is a concern to hear of possible capping of parish and town council precepts. It seems unreasonable to expect a greater range of services to be provided, when at the same time the amount that can be raised to pay for these services is limited. In many cases parish councils are raising their charges to pay for services which have been withdrawn by these larger authorities!

Despite these potential setbacks, we continue to work towards improving facilities within the village. After a concerted effort, Back Sands Lane was resurfaced at the end of last year and the programme of works for the coming year includes a number of roads in Pilling. Whether these will be completed to the standard that we expect remains to be seen, but it is at least a start.

An ANPR camera to cover the approaches to Eagland Hill has been purchased and we are expecting that this will aid the police in detecting crimes in an outlying area of the parish. If this is successful, the scheme may be extended to other parts of the village. As the number of houses in Pilling increases – a good number of these being what are termed affordable housing – we have held meetings with Regenda to discuss their lettings policy; it is only fair that such properties should be offered to people who have a direct Pilling connection in the first instance.

The 'water' meetings where a group of representatives of organisations meet to discuss problems within the village and to come up with a solution continue. This past year has seen extensive work on the outfall through the seawall and this should help the quicker drainage of water as will the clearing of ditches to allow for the free flow of water. As with many things the timescale for works does not always satisfy our needs.

We also seek to provide opportunities for the people of Pilling; in preceding years a number of defibrillators have been located around the village and training in using these devices has been on-going. The field where the new community hall will be sited has been opened to the village and a number of events have taken place on here, while work to improve the range of facilities has continued. A celebration to mark the 90th birthday of HM the Queen was held last year during which commemorative medals were presented to the children of Pilling.

Pilling remains a pleasant place in which to live and to raise a family; the variety of occasions when everyone comes together to celebrate is a regular part of the pattern of village life. To commemorate this; an event 'Celebrating Pilling' will be held in May on the new field, where there will be exhibitions, displays, food, fun, games and music. Indeed it will be a day to celebrate all that is good about living in Pilling.

To improve facilities and to provide opportunities for the people of Pilling requires the support of my fellow councillors, our lengthsman Graham and our clerk Gillian and to them I extend my grateful, thanks.

Pilling 20 20 is Marching On

Our Pilling 20 20 project has been boosted by a grant of over £61,000 to lay paths through the country park area and install a trim trail and also to extend the children's play area to include equipment suitable for "older" children. The funding is from Leader, a fund administered by Lancashire County Council; the cash coming from DEFRA and from Europe. Hopefully work will begin in early August and should be completed during autumn (weather permitting) and the 1200 metres of pathways will be suitable for walkers, joggers and wheel chairs. Benches are to be placed along the trail.



The pathways will be safer for joggers who at the moment have to use busy, pot-holed roads facing dangerous traffic conditions. The trim trail will have six stations where those so inclined can exercise on their jog around and there will be benches for the less active or tired.

The equipment on the extended children's play area should also be installed by the end of autumn and has been chosen after extensive research involving both of our schools and young people from our village.

Please use these facilities when they are ready — more is in the pipeline as our bid for funding for our village hall is now at Stage 2 with the National Lottery. We will have the decision about Stage 2 by the end of this year and if successful we enter the final stage when designs, tenders etc. occur. The Leader grant of £61k+ was an opportunity too good to miss and has not delayed nor hindered us in our work towards achieving the goal of securing funding for the new hall. What we really need are more people prepared to help us achieve success so please come forward to offer support and help.

Eagland Hill ANPR camera

Work has begun on the erection of an ANPR camera on Bradshaw Lane. Information will be accessed by the Police to support any investigations into thefts or damage.



Smallwood Hey Road and School Lane are designated 20 MPH. Pilling Parish Council has supported this safety initiative and wish to remind residents to respect those who live on these roads and keep to the speed limit.

The speed restriction runs from Mill Bridge past St. John's School and the Village Green and play area through to Smallwood Hey Road, taking in Carr Lane, parts of Fluke

Hall Lane and the first part of Wheel Lane.

To further remind drivers St. John's School warning lights flash at school times.

6 X 3 BEDROOM HOUSES AND 6 X 2 BEDROOM HOUSES FOR SOCIAL RENT

The properties were advertised through a variety of outlets which included Local Magazines, flyers in shops in the villages of Hambleton, Stalmine, Knott End, Preesall, Pilling, Garstang and Great Eccleston as well as on notice boards via the parish of Pilling. Local schools were also approached in order to promote the accommodation to families.

There were 26 applications received for the 3 bedroomed properties 13 of which had a connection to Wyre

There were 57 applications for the 2 bedroom properties 28 of which had a local connection to Wyre

On allocation of the accommodation 7 applicants had a direct local connection to Pilling whilst the other 5 had a local connection to the surrounding villages

Pilling Coffee Feast

The **Coffee Feast** is an important annual event in our community. Not only does it include all the Churches and schools in Pilling, it is a family event that involves all ages.

It is believed that the Coffee Feast (in one form or another) was first celebrated back in the 12th century by the monks of Cockersand Abbey and the tradition continues today.

This year the Grand Parade will leave the Community Field, Taylor's Lane at 1.45pm. It will be led by Pilling Jubilee Silver Band and will include the retiring and new Coffee Feast Queens and their retinues, visiting queens, decorated floats, morris dancers, people in fancy dress and much more.

The parade will progress to Pilling Nursing Home, where it will turn around. It will stop at St John's Church for a short family service and the crowning of the new Coffee Feast Queen. Finally it will return to the Community Field, where refreshments will be served.

There will be lots of special attractions suitable for the whole family from 4.15 pm, including children's sports and games, bouncy castles, face painting, a barbecue and a bar.

In order to pay for the event volunteers visit each household and invite them to make a donation. You can be assured that any money you give will only be used to fund this and future Coffee Feasts.
