Pilling Parish Precept

Each year a sum of money called the parish precept is collected through your council tax. In simple terms this is calculated by subtracting what the Parish Council will receive in income: from the amount it needs to spend in the Parish. This money is invested back into your neighbourhood by the Parish Council to improve facilities and services for you and your neighbours. The Parish Council also applies for grants and devolved services from the principal authorities.

There are a number of issues out of the control of the Parish Council which have a direct influence on the setting of the precept for the coming financial year.

Wyre Council has cut the grant given to the rural parishes of Wyre and are not going to pass on to the Parishes their part of the Localised Council Tax Support Grant from the Government. This will significantly alter the tax base used to calculate banding rates paid by householders and even though there is a slight increase in the number of households, due to the cuts, the amount calculated by Wyre is increased.

A household in band D will pay about £61.07 per year or £1.14per week, Pilling Parish Council has kept the increase down to 3pence per week.
